## OPENING REMARKS BY H.E. MR. KAZUYA OGAWA, AMBASSADOR OF JAPAN ON THE OCCASION OF THE 11<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL POLICY DIALOGUE ON THE JAPANESE ODA TO THE REPUBLIC OF RWANDA ON 4<sup>th</sup> November 2014

Thank you all for participating in the 11<sup>th</sup> annual policy dialogue. It is a great pleasure for me to hold this dialogue today.
